Priority Health Needs

Improve Access to High Quality Health Care and Services -

Provide access to culturally appropriate, affordable health care and coverage services for low-income and uninsured people.

Increase Access to Affordable Healthy Food -

Reduce consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages, improve access to fresh fruits and vegetables, and promote physical activity in schools and community settings. Educate and inspire children, teens, and adults to make healthier choices.

Increase Access to Safe and Healthy Environments -

Reduce violence and promote resiliency among at-risk youth. Increase access to and use of safe public recreational spaces.

Increase Employment and Vocational Training -

Provide at-risk youth opportunities to stay in school longer, graduate, and have skills to pursue a career. Increase the number of adults who receive a high school equivalency certificate.

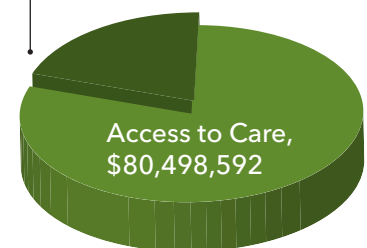
Examples of Our Investments

Kaiser Permanente provided Children's Network Inc. \$90,000 to support the Solano Resource Connection program's nine Family Resource Centers that help low-income families access housing, food, medical care, and other essential services.

On the Move received \$50,000 to support Project LEEP in reaching Napa County's low-income, transition-age, and Latino youth. Project LEEP served over 890 youth through individualized career counseling, hands-on work experience, employment coaching, and job placement.
